



Physical Education

Children from Kindergarten to Year 6 are taught Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) and participate in activities that provide the foundation for confident and competent participation in a variety of physical activities. This happens in Physical Education lessons, group sport sessions, morning fitness and general play.

Fundamental Movement Skills include rolling, balancing, sliding, jogging, running, leaping, jumping, hopping, dodging, galloping and skipping as well as floating and moving the body through water to safety. These skills are also developed using objects for bouncing, throwing, catching, kicking and striking.

This term we have been focusing on developing our throwing and catching skills, through explicit teaching and in modified game situations. Below are some pictures from these sessions.

Zones of Regulation

At Endeavour Schools we use the program Zones of Regulation to help our students to understand and manage their emotions. The program groups emotions into four colour zones– blue, green, yellow and red. The focus is on helping students to identify what zone they are in (i.e. emotion they are feeling) and equipping them with strategies to help manage this emotion. The strategies are designed to help students move back to the green zone (i.e. ready to learn zone).

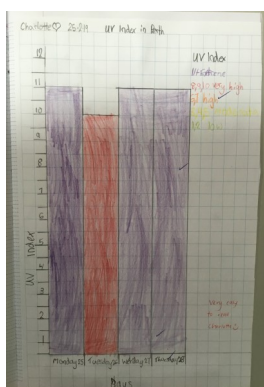
Science

This term we are looking at Biological Sciences, and in particular, studying adaptations to explore how some living things are uniquely adapted to survive in the desert. Since it is difficult to measure water loss in leaves without special equipment, we used sponges as models for leaves. Have a look at us investigating if sponges with smaller surface areas lose less water, and then displaying the results using a line graph.



Health

We have started the year by comparing sun safe campaigns and identifying ways and reasons to be sun safe. We then explored UV rays and using the Bureau of Meteorology website, created a histogram of Perth's UV index for the day or week. As the week had hot weather, it was not surprising that the UV index was either Extreme or Very High. We found it interesting that different capital cities had different UV indexes on the same day.

Hello Endeavour Schools students, parents and staff.

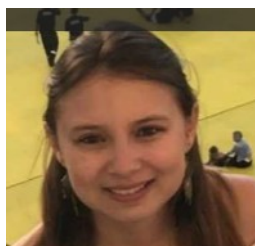
I am so excited and grateful to be part of your Schools and to journey with you all through 2019.

Common Offences

- Parking contrary to signs or limitations
- Parking against the flow of traffic
- Parking on a footpath or pedestrian crossing
- Parking within 10 metres of a building property line at an intersection
- Stopping in a bus zone
- Stopping on a verge
- Stopping in a disabled area



How Can Parents Help to Keep Children Safe?

- Slow down around schools and be aware
- Walk or cycle to school when dropping off or collecting children
- Park nearby and walk a short distance to the school
- If possible plan your trip so you arrive on the school side of the road
- Observe parking time restrictions around schools
- Observe parking signage at all times
- Form a School Road Safety committee (contact your principal and P&C)
- Consider using public transport.
