## From the Pen of the Principals

### Primary School

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Community Members,

Welcome back to the new school term. This term will again be an exciting one with Year 6 camp, sporting carnivals, incursions and Mothers' day activities just to name a few.

#### NAPLAN Assessments

The annual National Assessment Program – Literacy And Numeracy (NAPLAN) is scheduled for Week 3 of this term and involves our Year 3 and 5 students. My advice to parents is treat these days as normal school days, try to reduce any anxieties and reassure children that there is nothing to worry about. Children should always get the right amount of sleep and eat a healthy breakfast, not just on NAPLAN days, but every day. This is how children are best prepared for school, and more importantly, learning.

#### Student Behaviour Policy

Staff at Endeavour Schools are currently working through a process to update our school's behaviour policy. This review is important in ensuring our procedures are suitable for meeting the current needs of our students. This new policy will include a stronger emphasis on reinforcing positive behaviour expectations and the introduction of a good standing requirement. Once this revised policy is completed it will be communicated to all students and families. Currently all in-class behaviour is managed through a six step process, which is as follows:

1. Rule reminder
2. Warning
3. Reflection time
4. Reflection sheet
5. Buddy class
6. Office referral

#### Dress Code

At Endeavour Schools we have a school dress code which has been endorsed by the school board. The dress code helps to enhance a sense of belonging for students, reduces the pressure for the wearing of "fad" clothing and assists staff to maintain a duty of care through easy identification. Our school dress code consists of a blue school polo shirt (or faction shirt equivalent), blue school jumper and black shorts/skirt/skort/pants. Items such as shorts, skirts and skirts should be mid-thigh length or longer. The P&C Association runs a uniform shop for our community and stocks all items of the school dress code. They also have a limited range of second hand items for sale as well. We strongly encourage all students to come to school in the correct school uniform, especially with the recent arrival of the cold mornings.

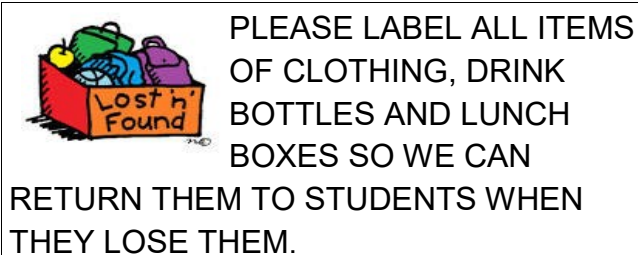
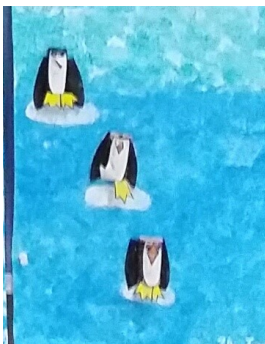
