Behaviour– Token System

As part of our school's behaviour policy review, we are looking at implementing a revised whole-school positive behaviour token system. On Monday Mrs Gorbould and I met with our student councillors to hear their ideas and thoughts on a possible system. I was impressed with the ideas they came up with. For our revised system to be effective it is important that our students have a say in it and are part of the plan. The reason for this is if our students don't see the value in it then implementation will be difficult.

Principals' Reward Afternoon Tea

Last term we held a successful reward afternoon tea with students and parents which focussed on writing improvement. The feedback the school has received in relation to this initiative has been very positive. We will be holding another one this term which will focus on the improvement in Mathematics. Later this term invites will be sent out with students who have been selected, with their parents invited to come along. At Endeavour Schools we believe it is important that we share student successes with families as they play a crucial role in their success.

Resolution of Issues

A positive partnership between the school and home is important in supporting the educational needs of your child. When an issue arises relating to your child, the first point of contact should be your child's teacher. It is best to organise a meeting at a mutually convenient time so any issues can be discussed in detail and solutions developed, rather than during student drop off time. If an issue is unable to be resolved the next step is to organise a meeting with a Deputy Principal. If after Deputy Principal support the issue is still unresolved, then a meeting should be arranged with myself.

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

'Winter is coming.....'

As we are slowly moving into winter weather and with the cold mornings, just a gentle reminder that students need to have their school winter uniform items clearly named so that they can be returned if they get lost. As outlined in our School Dress Code, students are requested to wear clothing in school colours. Where girls wear leggings, they should be black and preferably worn under skirts or dresses. All long pants should be plain black - patterns and logos are not acceptable. All shorts are expected to be mid-thigh in length throughout the year. We do understand that there are times when the correct school uniform is unable to be worn and in this instance the uniform 'alternatives' should be worn. Building update

The tender for our new classroom, therapy room and office was allocated at the start of this month with a completion date of 12th December 2019. We haven't got a start date yet but are anticipating some works to begin fairly soon. Please bear with us while this construction is underway as we know that there will be some disruptions and inconvenience but I'm sure the result will be worth it. In order to start the building process, we previously engaged the services of Rockingham Tree Services to relocate Mr Hansen's Memorial tree over the past few months. Wayne from RTS has been working on gently preparing for the move which happened 2 weeks ago. He is continuing to monitor the tree and we are hoping for a successful transplant operation.

Students who arrive before the start of the school day

When students arrive at school before 8.25am they are to wait in the Achiever Block alcove until classes open. Staff supervise students in this area and students are NOT to be in any other part of the school grounds before 8.25am. This is for safety reasons and applies to students from ALL year levels. Students with notes for the office or library books to return will be able to do this when they are dismissed from the supervision area.
