



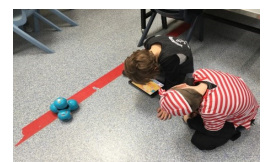
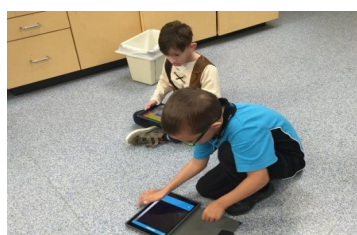
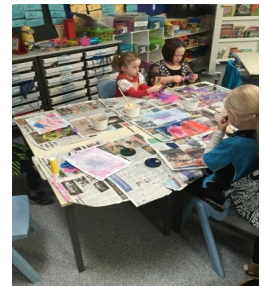

Hello Endeavour Schools community,

Online Safety

Being connected to the internet is part of our daily lives, which means children need to be taught how to be safe whilst online. As a community we can all play a part in promoting online safety. Children should not share personal information whilst online and only access age appropriate websites and social platforms (many websites and social platforms have age requirements for their use, often above what a primary-school age child would be). Children's online use can have an impact at school when issues that occur online outside school hours are carried into the school grounds the following day. School Behaviour Policy

In this final instalment of communicating our new revised behaviour policy, I have focused on outlining our bullying processes. It is important to understand what bullying is and isn't. Bullying involves a misuse of power where someone intentionally threatens or harms someone on multiple occasions. A one off incident involving name calling is not bullying. When an incident is reported an initial investigation is conducted by school staff to work out if it is bullying. The process followed is as follows:

- ♦ **Incident identified as not bullying** – Managed in line with the school's normal behaviour process and recorded within school records.
- ♦ **Incident identified as bullying** – Further investigation occurs and is managed using restorative justice approaches. An action plan is developed. The incident is recorded within school records and parents of all parties are notified. The action plan is followed up, monitored and reviewed with all parties.

Some of the ways the school helps support anti-bullying strategies include:

- ♦ Making students aware of our school's policy,
- ♦ Maintaining caring and supportive relationships with students,
- ♦ Development of self and emotional competency through programs such as Zones of Regulation and Friendly Schools Plus, and
- ♦ Openly talking about bullying with students and explicitly teaching them strategies to support them in a variety of school situations.

Family-school partnerships extend beyond family involvement in volunteering at the school, to having a deliberate focus on influencing and improving learning opportunities and wellbeing outcomes.
