Emotional Regulation

A key part of our vision at Endeavour Schools is developing the whole child, which includes their emotional wellbeing. Some children can have difficulties in managing their emotions, which can impact on their ability to build positive friendship groups and demonstrate their true potential. It is important we support children to identify and manage their emotions. At Endeavour Schools we explicitly teach students this through the Zones of Regulation program. This involves students identifying how they feel based on four colours (blue, green yellow and red) and providing them with tools to manage their changing emotions in different situations. We strive for children to be in the green zone which means they are calm and are ready to learn.

Book Week Door Displays

It has been great to see a number of class doors receiving a makeover as part of Book Week. The displays have linked in well with this year's theme of "Reading is my Superpower". Some photos have been included in this newsletter and I encourage everyone to take a walk around the school to view these displays.

Cyber Safety Session

Yesterday (Wednesday) YSafe came out to our school and delivered some presentations to our Year 5 and 6 students. The sessions covered a number of key messages about being safe whilst online. I would like to thank the City of Rockingham for covering the cost of these sessions.

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope all our students are enjoying our new Music Walls and chalk boards in Discovery Playground. These are our new additions to add a variety of sensory experiences to our student's play this year. Discovery Playground offers a variety of textures, substances, ingredients and props which come together to create an overall awareness and stimulation of the core senses.

Everything from water/sand play, sensory/music, painting/chalk drawing, climbing/vestibular movement and even interaction with insects (the earthworms are currently in abundance!), there's an almost inexhaustible selection to choose from every day and as the weather changes so does the play experiences for our students!

The benefits are many and varied:

1. Sensory play builds nerve connections within the developing brain's neural pathways, which trigger a child's inclination for and ability in completing more complex learning tasks
2. Sensory play supports language development, cognitive growth, motor skills, problem solving skills, and social interaction
3. Sensory play aids in developing and enhancing memory functioning
4. Sensory play is great for calming an anxious or frustrated child
5. Sensory play helps children learn vitally important sensory attributes (hot, cold, sticky, dry, etc.)

.....and sometimes just because it's FUN.

We are looking forward to a very busy few weeks coming up with students attending out-of-school events for both Music and Dance and this culminates for this term with our Schools' performances at YOH FEST on Wed, 4th Sept and WAGSMS on Thu, 12th Sept. We have two groups performing and we hope everyone has fun and enjoys the experience.

Last Friday, Mr Burgess, Mrs Ritchie (School Board Chair) and I proudly attended the Warnbro Cell Excellence in Education Awards at the Mary Davies Centre in Baldyville. 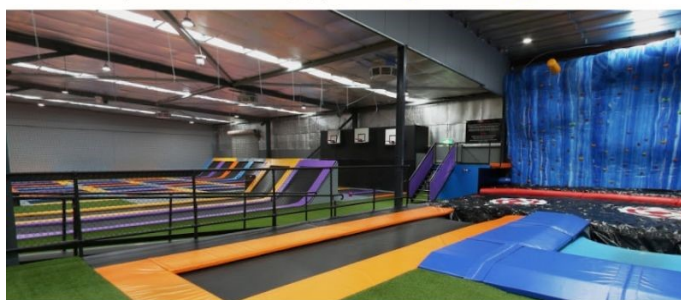
