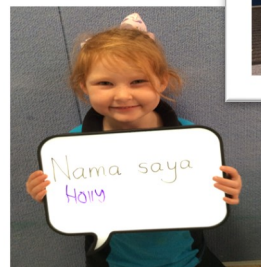
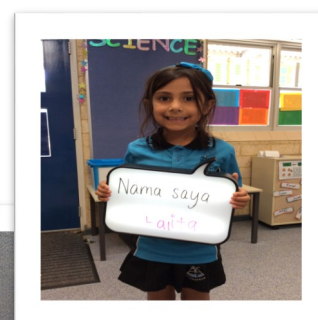
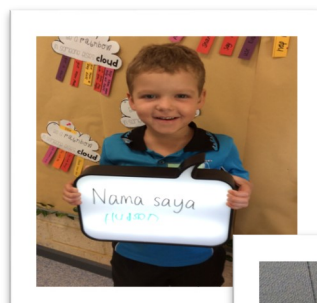


INDONESIAN AT ENDEAVOUR!

It is likely that you will have noticed some building activity in the area behind the Library and we are pleased to let you know that this area is being developed as an Outdoor Classroom in an amphitheatre style. SBS cannot guarantee any applications submitted after this date will be processed in time for transport in Term 1 2021. The dates outlined above are to ensure that students who are eligible for transport assistance in 2021 are processed in a timely manner and families are notified as quickly as possible of the outcome of their application.*

If you need any assistance with applications for School Bus Services I am more than happy to help out in any way so, please come and see me or arrange a time to meet with me to complete the application process.

NAIDOC Week 2020



Kaya! (Hello in Noongar)

NAIDOC Week is in Week 5, with this year's NAIDOC theme being '**Always Was, Always Will Be**'. It is a week to celebrate the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are the Traditional Owners of lands in Australia. They have cared for this country for more than 65,000 years.

NAIDOC week at Endeavour will start with a morning assembly on Monday, 9th November. Parents are welcome to attend and will be expected to follow the COVID-19 distancing rules. Hand sanitiser will be available.

Students and staff are invited to dress in NAIDOC tops or tops featuring Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander designs. Alternatively, students can wear Aboriginal flag colours (red, yellow, or black), Torres Strait Islander flag colours (green, blue, white, or black) or their faction shirts for the day. Black bottoms and correct school appropriate footwear must be worn.

During NAIDOC Week students will be creating a Wall of Fame of Indigenous people who have impacted on Australia. Students in Kindy - Year 6 will have an opportunity to participate in various classroom activities such as making bracelets throughout the week.

Enclosed with this Newsletter is a colouring in sheet for you to do. Put your name and room number on the sheet and bring to the front office before Friday, 6th November and your picture will be displayed at the NAIDOC Assembly being held on Monday, 9th November. More sheets are available in the front office.

Damper Recipe

Ingredients:

- 2 self-rising flour
- 2 cups plain flour
- Pinch of salt
- 2 cups water

Method:

- Preheat oven (fan forced) to 170 degrees.
- Mix dry ingredients together in a bowl.
- Slowly add the water and continue mixing with together with your hands.
- Knead the dough on a floured board till you have a soft dough.
- Be careful to not over knead.
- Lightly oil baking bread tin/tray, then lightly add flour to tin/tray before adding in the damper.
- Cook in the oven for 45mins or until golden brown.
- To know if your damper is cooked, tap on it to make sure it sounds hollow.
- Serve with butter.

Faction Carnival Fun

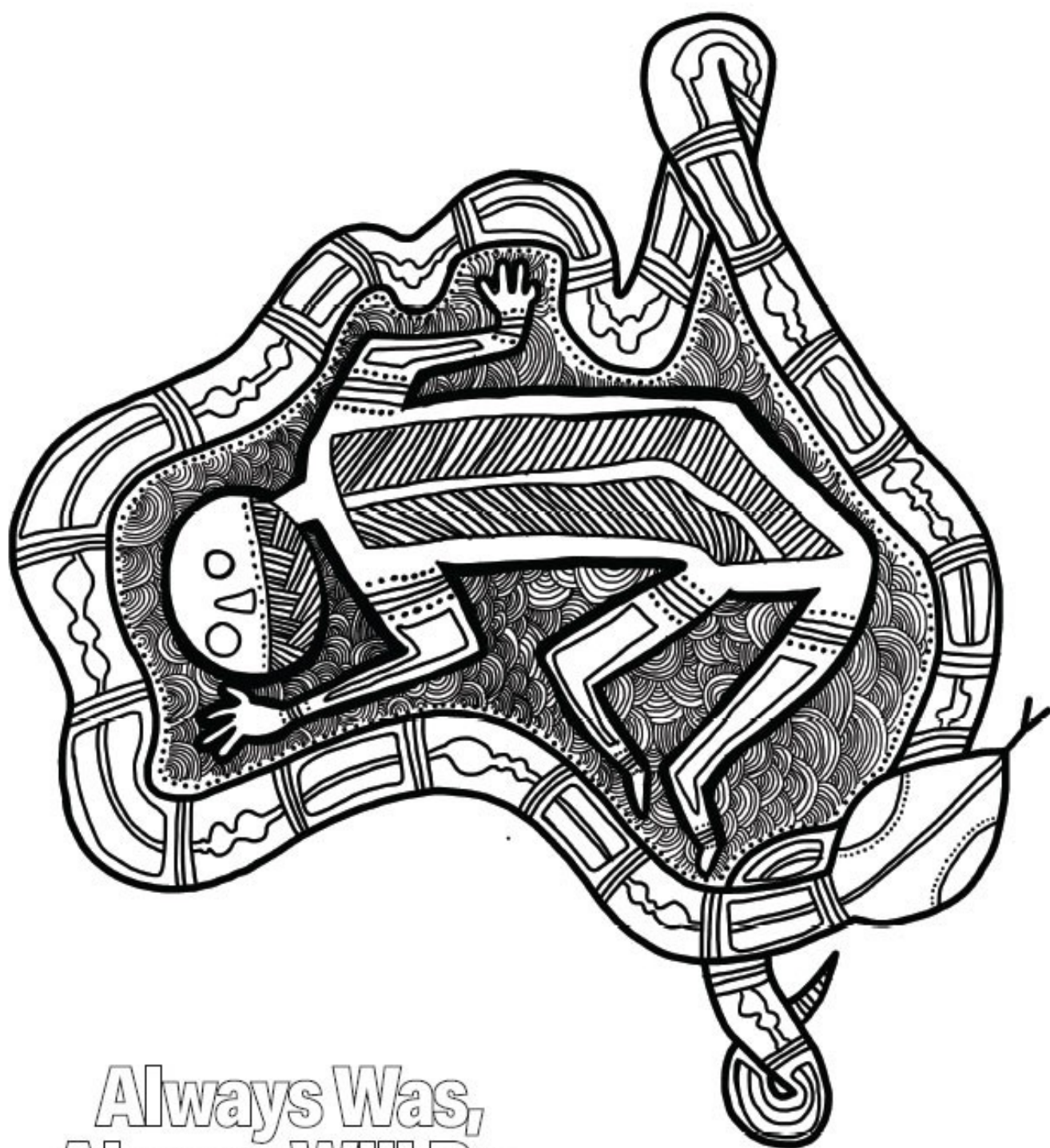

The Rainbow Serpent came out of the Dreamtime to create this land. It is represented by the snake and it forms the shape of Australia, which symbolises how it created our lands. The colour from the Rainbow Serpent is reflected onto the figure to display our connection to the Rainbow Serpent, thus our connection to country. The overlapping colours on the outside is the Dreamtime. The figure inside the shape of Australia is a representation of Indigenous Australians showing that this country - since the dawn of time - always was, and always will be Aboriginal land.

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
