Dear Endeavour Schools' families,

This week we have been celebrating NAIDOC week. NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each year to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support our local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

This year, the theme 'Always Was, Always Will Be', recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years. We began the week with an assembly where our Senior Choir performed 'We Are One' and our Junior Choir performed 'Innanay'.

Mrs Gail Zagami organised some special ochre that she used to paint the faces of our choir members. Gail also made 120 headbands for our choir members to wear. Gail shared some of her knowledge about the Noongar peoples and we learnt about the different symbols used in face painting and their significance. I would like to thank Gail for sharing her knowledge.

Our Positive Behaviour Support team have been working hard with staff and students to develop our draft copy of our Behaviour Expectations Matrix. We have provided a draft for you and would really appreciate your feedback. We would like to have a mascot for each of our four behaviour expectations: Respect, Responsibility, Reconciliation and Resilience. We are running a competition to design a mascot for each expectation and are keen for the whole community to join in and submit ideas. Please see information within this newsletter. The PBS team have commenced developing lessons to teach expected behaviours within Endeavour Schools. Our first lesson is 'We play fairly and by the rules'. The PBS team has produced a video which is a fun and innovative way to introduce the lesson. Staff act out the 'non behaviours' and students act out the 'expected behaviour'. This video was presented at our assembly last week. Our next lesson is 'We keep our hands and feet to ourselves'.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 restrictions will impact on some of our end of year events. Rather than cancel, we have come up with a compromise that will enable us to ensure our students have the opportunity to celebrate their achievements. These changes will be communicated in a separate letter and will be sent out with this newsletter. I appreciate your understanding.
